In times of happiness or worry or change, who do you call on for support? Family? Friends? Your faith community? Having a network of meaningful relationships is a critical component of a healthy, happy life for all people. For people who have disabilities, it is important to build connections outside of immediate family and support staff.

This network of connections beyond immediate family is often referred to as social capital. Having more social capital leads to increased opportunities and a sense of belonging—whether in school, at work, or in our community.

Starbridge is pleased to welcome internationally respected scholar Dr. Al Condeluci back to Rochester to continue the conversation about social capital and how this leads to inclusive, vibrant communities.

In the morning session, Al will review what social capital is and why belonging matters. He will debut new information from recent research conducted by CLASS, Chatham University, and Mamre, an organization in Brisbane, Australia. Together they are examining patterns of family engagement.

In the afternoon session, we will continue the conversation around some important aspects of social capital, exploring questions such as:

- What is your greatest fear in engagement?
- What skills do you think are necessary in building relationships?
- What role does culture play in building relationships?
